The International School assists by renting several dorm rooms for international students, which can be booked on a first-come, first-served basis. If you can't find accommodation in our dorms, you will be able to rent an apartment alone or with friends in the surrounding areas. However, please be aware that monthly rentals throughout the Tel Aviv Metropolitan Area are high, so you will need to ensure you have the finances to cover these costs.

Students are required to arrange their own accommodation. Finding housing on and around the university campus can be difficult, so it is highly recommended that you arrange accommodation well in advance.

Transportation on campus

Bar-Ilan University provides a shuttle service within the campus (free of charge) including a special vehicle accessible to people with disabilities. Shuttle frequency is between 5-7 minutes.



Public Transport in Israel

Busses and trains are only accessible using a **Ray Kay card**.

This card can be charged with cash electronically and used on all public transport. Many bus and train stations also have charging stations, where the card can be filled using a credit card.

The Rav Kav card can be purchased in any Rav Kav service station. You can also order it online and it will be delivered to your address in Israel.
