If English is not the medium of instruction at their home institution, students should achieve a TOEFL score of 79 or above (on the Internet-based test), IELTS Band 6.5 or above or Chinese Mainland's College English Test Band 6 or above. We normally offer Mandarin courses for non-Chinese speakers and basic Cantonese courses (subject to confirmation by the department nearer the semester).

Full course load per semester <i>(for full-time students)</i>	The load for full-time students varies from 12 (minimum) to 18 credits (maximum). Each course usually carries 3 credits, equivalent to, 2 hours' lectures and 1 hour tutorial per week.
How many credits would you recommend an incoming exchange student to take? How many courses does this correspond to?	Most inbound exchange students take 12-15 credits (that is, 4-5 courses) per semester.
Will you send transcripts to the university or directly to the students?	Transcripts will be sent to the partner university <u>directly</u> after the students have completed their studies, i.e. around February for Semester A and around July for Semester B .

Health Insurance Information	
Health insurance regulations	It is mandatory for exchange students to have suitable and adequate insurance for the entire period of their study at CityU. The insurance should cover but not limited to travel, personal accidents, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalisation and emergency evacuation/ repatriation.
	If exchange students do not have their own insurance coverage before coming to Hong Kong, or if they wish to buy additional insurance, they may enrol in the CityU-contracted insurance plan. The CityU-contracted insurance plan is available to all non-local students, and it provides relatively basic coverage such as personal accident and medical benefits.
	Students will be invited to enrol in the CityU-contracted insurance plan when they fill-out the online pre-enrolment form. Once they have opted in the plan, they will not be allowed to opt out afterwards, and they will have to settle the insurance payment accordingly.
	The insurance premium for the academic year 2020-21 was HK\$266 per student (around USD34). The rates are subject to change.
