Application Procedure	Students have to be officially nominated by the partner university. Erasmus coordinators are asked to send a list of nominees (including their e-mail contacts and field of study) to FSV Incoming Students Coordinator, Ms Barbora Stará, at incoming@fsv.cuni.cz. Together with the nomination the following documents should be enclosed:		
Registration	Nominated students have to complete an on-line registration form, print two documents generated by the on-line system (Application Form + Learning Agreement) and get them stamped and signed by their university Erasmus Coordinator. English Language Requirements			

It is assumed that applicants have a sufficient knowledge of English to attend classes and to write papers in the English language. Students who are **not native speakers** may be asked to demonstrate their ability to study in English, e.g. by presenting the results of any language tests they have taken. Although we welcome TOEFL and IELTS, they are not necessarily a condition of entry. A real ability to study in English is more important.

Orientation Week

The Faculty of Social Sciences regularly runs an Orientation Program in both winter and summer semester. This program is designed especially for incoming students in order to take care of many of the practical arrangements related to studies (registration, student travel passes, access to Charles University libraries, etc.).

Subjects Taught in English

The Faculty of Social Sciences of Charles University has 5 institutes:

- Institute of Political Studies
- Institute of International Studies
- Institute of Economic Studies
- Institute of Sociological Studies
- Institute of Communication Studies and Journalism

The faculty has a wide selection of subjects taught in English in Political Science, International Relations and Economics & Finance. All nominated students will receive a <u>list of courses</u> taught in English available to our and international students.

Since the agreement between our universities is intended for studies in the field of the institutes, your nominated students are required to choose at least 51% of their classes from the assigned institute.

Registration for Classes

Students can enrol in both Bachelor's and Master's degree courses regardless of their academic level. However, the list of the chosen subjects has to be selected carefully and approved by the student's home university.

Student Information System (SIS)	This search engine is the best source of information about classes, and it also includes information about the student's status and results. SIS can be accessed under <u>this link.</u>	
Note	 SIS includes information about classes from all the Faculties at Charles University, taught in all languages. Students have to choose "Faculty of Social Sciences" from the drop-down box, as class has to be chosen "courses for incoming students" and always double-check the language of instruction and the actual semester in the course description. Students have to pay attention to the last letter of the subject code. "B" at the end of the subject code refers to the subject taught at the Bachelor's level. "M" stands for the Master's level. Students should take at least half of the courses with the Faculty of Social Sciences. Students can enrol in courses in total of 30 ECTS.

We offer <u>Czech language classes</u> at various levels, from Beginners to Upper Intermediate. Incoming students are welcome to register for these. However, we must point out that, because these classes are not part of the standard curriculum, they are not financed by the Czech Ministry of Education. We therefore have to make a small charge to cover our costs.

Housing

Erasmus students are welcome to apply for accommodation in Charles University – Halls of Residence, the online application form includes a housing option.

Deposit & Cost	Since we have been facing overbooking of our accommodation facilities, we will ask your nominees to confirm their housing reservation by paying a deposit of 1800 CZK (approx. 70 €) plus the price for 1 month at a dormitory 2500-3800 CZK (approx. 100 - 150 €).

	Visa to the Czech Republic	
Students from non-EU and non-EFTA countries will need a student visa. To obtain their visa in a timely manner, we strongly recommend students to send their applications in as early as possible. Visa arrangement process may take up to 3 months.		
	Semester-length students should apply for a student visa (long-stay visa for the purpose of study)	

- Full year students (2 semesters) should apply for a long-term residence permit

Financial Support

Students coming through the programme **Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility** are eligible for a scholarship (**financial support composed from individual support + travel support**). This financial support will be provided in Euros after signing a Grant Agreement. Students will receive their scholarship in cash in a cashier/cash desk of any branch of Komerční banka in Czech Republic (<u>https://www.kb.cz/en/branches-and-atms</u>). In the beginning of their stay students will receive 70% of the total amount of the scholarship. The remaining 30% of their scholarship will be paid during the last month of study visit after the completion of the Online EU Survey.
