ERASMUS+ SHORT- STAY MOBILITIES for the academic year 2023/2024

Short-stay mobilities provide students with another opportunity to travel abroad within Erasmus+ programme.

The applicants can use the list of partner organizations as possible contact points on the web in the section "Bilateral agreements" <u>https://fsv.cuni.cz/en/exchange/erasmus/outgoing-students/erasmus-placements</u> or secure a Short-stay mobility in an organization of their own.

It may not be performed in the EU institutions and organizations governing the EU programs.

The applicants address their chosen organization and provide a Letter of Acceptance.

Erasmus+ Short-stay Mobilities are open to all the students registered in accredited bachelor's, masters' or doctoral study programmes, who will be properly registered for the studies at the FSV UK throughout the entire duration of the stay abroad.

A Short-stay mobility may last from 5 days (at the minimum) up to 30 days (at the maximum).

Admission requirements: a current registration to the 1st year of bachelor's studies at the minimum or 1st year of master's studies at the time the application is submitted; proficient language skills in accordance with the destination where the short-stay mobility will be held and requirements of the chosen organization.

<u>The applications are submitted</u> through an admission proceedings at institutes or during the entire year through the International Office.

The applications sent to the International Office must contain:

- Information of study results at the FSV (SIS results with indicated GPA).
- CV in English (max. 1-2 pages).
- Motivation letter in English demonstrating how the short-stay mobility relates to the study field (max. 1 page).
- Documentation of language proficiency (preferably a language certificate).
- Information on an estimated term of a short-stay mobility, name of a pre-arranged organization and the name, telephone number and email of a contact person.
- Approvals of a short-stay mobility by the Academic tutor (or the Director of the Institute). The form is available here: <u>https://fsv.cuni.cz/en/exchange/erasmus/outgoing-students/erasmusplacements</u>.

<u>The applications within admission proceedings</u> can be submitted by students to the particular institute except for the Institute of Journalism and Communication Studies and the Institute of Political Studies which does not organize the admission proceedings.

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The applicants will submit as follows:

- Information on study results at the FSV (SIS results with indicated GPA).
- CV in English (max. 1-2 pages).
- Motivation letter in English demonstrating how the short-stay mobility relates to the study program (max. 1 page).
- Documentation of language proficiency (preferably a language certificate).
- Information on an estimated term of a short-stay mobility, name of a pre-arranged organization and the name, telephone number and email of a contact person.

The deadline for the submission of all documents at the respective institutes is **30th October** (please submit the applications to the coordinators listed below). The time and date of the interviews will be announced by the respective institutes in due time.
