

### MEDICAL CARE - NON EU/ EEA STUDENTS

As a Non EU/EEA student you need to have a travel insurance covering comprehensive health care set up with PVZP a.s.



If in need of a medical care ALWAYS call the non-stop Helpline unless it is emergency.

Contact details are on the backside of your insurance card (for PVZP clients the helpline is 296 841 333).



#### MEDICAL CARE - NON EU/EEA STUDENTS

#### The helpline can

send a list of contracted doctors in the place of residence, make an appointment to the doctor, confirm whether the required care will be reimbursed or not.

You must always identify yourself by the number of the insurance – it is stated on your insurance card.

If you urgently need a doctor, you can visit public hospitals.

## MEDICAL CARE - NON EU/ EEA STUDENTS

#### At a Doctor / In a Hospital

When your doctor/nurse asks the insurance company, say 'private insurance from ... (the name of your insurance provider).

If your provider is PVZP (code 333), please make sure that it will not be confused with VZP, which is the public insurance (code 111).



## MEDICAL CARE - NON EU/ EEA STUDENTS

#### What to do when Medical Care is charged

In case the doctor wants to charge you directly for the provided care, she/he should notify you in advance.

**Keep everything** - medical report, test results, receipt, prescription for the drug (if taken by the pharmacy, make a screenshot) - just scan or take a picture so that everything is readable Report the insurance event. Usually you can do it by filling out an online form (<a href="here">here</a> for PVZP clients). Please check out your insurance provider webpages.

Hospitals usually invoice directly to the insurance company.



#### MEDICAL CARE - EU/ EEA STUDENTS

#### Holders of EHIC (EUROPEAN HEALTH INSURANCE CARD)

Upon your arrival <u>we recommend</u> to register your card (EHIC) at Czech Insurance Provider - less paperwork at the doctor.

In case you are not registered, you will be asked to fill a few forms before the treatment. For detailed information see here.

Friendly warning: Not all the treatments are covered by the EHIC.
WE RECOMMEND that YOU HAVE EXTRA COMMERCIAL TRAVEL INSURANCE.

## MEDICAL CARE - EU/ EEA STUDENTS

In case of **medical emergency**, the urgent transportation by ambulance to the hospital is covered by the insurance system and is provided free of charge. Have the EHIC or Provisional Certificate, with you.

Treatment of medical specialists – you need to be refered by the GP.

#### MEDICAL CARE - TIPS

List of the medical care facilities (GP, Dentist, Hospital ...) can be found <a href="here">here</a>.

Should you be taking medicine regularly, get advise from your GP or specialist before coming to CZ. Some medicine might not be sold here nor prescribed by other doctors.

Take care of your mental health.
Should you need help, contact the <u>Psychological Assistance of CU</u>.

In the Czech Republic non-prescription medicines are sold only in pharmacies (Lékárna).



If you do not know what to do, talk to your IO Coordinator.

#### MEDICAL CARE - OVERVIEW

Non EU/ EEA students must have a travel insurance covering comprehensive health care set up with PVZP a.s. before they come to the CZ.


EU/EEA students should be holders of EHIC and register the card upon their arrival. As not everything is covered by the general insurance (EHIC), it is recommended to have a private travel insurance as well.

Emergency medical care is free of charge as well as the trasport to the hospital. Visit at the dentist or specialist is usually paid.

In non life threathing situations always call your insurance company (EU/EEA students), The AXA helpline (Non EU/ EEA students).
