9 PhD programs (CZ/EN)

- CZ:EN approximately 79:21
- Trend: less CZ students, more EN students
- CZ programs converge to being operated (almost) fully in English; seminars in English, all instruction materials and emails in English, and publications in English

What attracts EN applicants?

- Study program 90.9% (3rd out of 15)
- Charles University 78.2% (1st out of 15)
- Faculty of Social Sciences 78.2% (5th out of 15)
- Prague 78.2% (2nd out of 15)
- Czech Republic 70.9% (11th out of 15)

Who is Who

- 9 **Program Directors**: responsible for all the content and all operations
- 5 **Directors of Institutes**: closely coordinate with Program Directors, responsible for all financial decisions and institute-level policies (TAs, research bonuses etc.)
- 5 **Centers of Doctoral Studies**: conduct research and administrative tasks, especially internal/informal (within Institutes, especially communication with students); collaborate closely with administration of Institutes
- Administration at FSV: core administrative tasks, especially formal tasks, and all legally binding decisions
- **Vice-Dean**: regulations, monitoring, overlooks operations, signs all legally binding decisions, communication with Program Directors, Institutes and Charles University



Delegation

- Programs (and Institutes) are largely self-governed.
- Each Institute is expected to set the optimal structure of tasks for the incoming PhD students (integration into existing research structures: UNCE Fellowships, teaching seminars, administrative tasks in CDSs etc.)
- Financial responsibility for all key program aspects is fully given to
 Directors of Institutes, and it is assumed that Program Directors and
 Directors of Institute set jointly the optimal strategy.

Courses/Seminars Surveys

- every term, including the opportunity to provide feedback
- Spring 2024: overall grade **4.76** (scale 1-5)
- Fall 2024: finished last week

Annual Survey

- late August/early September
- motivations, career outlook, estimated success probability
- feedback on the most enjoyable and most challenging points
- feedback on the level of difficulty, the amount of work and time pressure
- communication frequency: advisor, other faculty, students
- feedback on advice (dissertation research, overall progress, resources)

Full time v. Part time

Full time students

- stipend + wage
- involved in departmental activities (TA, RA)
- typically, extra study requirements (seminars, defense attendance)
- typically, stricter monitoring of progress (Working Papers)

Part time students

- no stipend
- strict focus on dissertation
- identical access to supervision
- minimal involvement in departmental activities
- less strict progress, but identical deadlines (at most 8 years)



Full time v. Part time

- Application to Part time
 - Admitted
 - Not admitted
- Application to Full time
 - Admitted to Full time
 - Not admitted to Full time
 - A) If Not Qualified for Part time, then Not admitted
 - B) If Qualified for Part time, the Applicant Receives and Offer for Part time
 - B1) If accepts, the Applicant is admitted to Part time
 - B2) If rejects, the Applicant is Not admitted
