



Practical Information

Here is some crucial and practical information for you in terms of the organisation of your travel to the Czech Republic and expectations from us:

- **Transport from the Airport to the city centre**

The arrival will be through our Vaclav Havel Airport Prague for most of you. Transportation between Václav Havel Airport and the Prague centre is provided by public transport buses, which run at several-minute intervals. The stops are located directly in front of the terminals.

For the fastest transportation to the centre of Prague by public transport 1, we recommend using bus line 19 (Terminal 1 / Terminal 2 - Veleslavín Railway Station) with a transfer to metro A or bus line 100 (Terminal 1 / Terminal 2 - Zličín) with transfer to metro B.

On public transport buses, the current time tickets are valid and it is not necessary to book the seat in advance. All you have to do is buy a ticket before boarding the bus.

Time tickets - 90 minutes/40 CZK, 30 minutes/30CZK, 24 hours/120CZK, 72 hours/330CZK.
Or you can use a taxi (about 600CZK) or uber.

- **Transport within the Czech Republic**

Prague has a very good public transport system. You can travel by metro, trams, buses or taxis. You can get almost everywhere by public transport – and the tickets are quite cheap. You can learn more about the public transport system [here](#) and about tickets [here](#).



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- **Currency**

The official czech currency is the Czech crown - Česká Koruna - CZK: 1 € = 24,73 CZK. Many places accept credit cards and also payments in Euros. [Here](#) is the list of the best Exchange places in Prague.

- **Covid19 restrictions**

As of 9th April 2022, the protective measures regarding the conditions of entry into the Czech Republic in relation to the epidemic of covid-19 have been suspended. Entry into the Czech Republic is no longer subject to any special epidemiological conditions to prevent the spread of the disease. The entry ban for foreigners from third countries and the obligation to prove infection-free status have been lifted.
